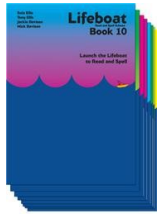

The Pupil Premium

A Guide for Parents



Pupil Premium funding is given to schools so that they can support their disadvantaged pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. For the current academic year (2019.20), the school receives **£1320** for each pupil eligible for free school meals.

£83,160

This is the amount of Pupil Premium funding St George's will receive this year.

How we will spend the money?

Group sizes in years 6 will be reduced to allow greater support and targeted teaching.

Class teachers will be released to work on a 1:1 basis with some eligible children for catch-up work, pre-teaching and mentoring.

There will be maths homework clubs for years 3, 4 and 5. A special maths club led by an experienced consultant will benefit year 6.

Higher Level Teaching Assistants will deliver interventions such as 1stClass@Number1 and 1st Class@Number 2, Lifeboat phonics scheme, Language for Thinking, Speech & Language programmes and Social Skills Groups.

School visits and outings will be funded for pupil premium children to ensure that eligible children do not miss valuable experiences for financial reasons.

Extra-curricular activities and music lessons will be funded to ensure that eligible children do not miss enrichment opportunities for financial reasons.
