A huge well done to our Netball team for two fantastic wins last Tuesday! 7-1 against St. Michael's and 12-1 against Worcesters (report in last week's newsletter).

It has been a very busy few weeks with regards to sport matches! Well done to our Girls' Football team for two wins earlier this week: 1-0 against St Andrew's and 1-0 against Worcesters.

For those of you who drive your children to school, please:

- Park considerately to our neighbours
- Turn your engine off, not leave it running while parked
- Make every effort to walk all or some of the way to school if possible. It's healthy and good for the environment.

Catholic Social Teaching

In the Autumn term, our school took part in an air monitoring project led a charity close to our hearts, Asthma and Lung UK. With some help from Tony, the Green Team and Green Patrol put up special tubes across different areas in the playground. After 4 weeks, we took them down and sent them off to a scientific laboratory to be tested. These results give us a snapshot of nitrogen dioxide pollution in the sites we tested. The legal annual target for this pollutant is 40 micrograms per cubic metres of air. Our results suggest that pollution in none of the sites we tested breached this limit. However, it is important to note that the World Health Organisation state that there is no safe level of air pollution to breathe in, much like there's no safe amount of dirty water to drink. So even though our results did not breach legal limits- no level of pollution is safe for our lungs. At our school, we want to reduce the amount of pollution. In 2021, the highest amount of nitrogen dioxide in Enfield was 45.0 – this means that Enfield had illegal levels of pollution. The children in the Green Team and Green Patrol quite rightly said that t is not fair that people in our local community have to breathe in dirty air. But together, we can create change. Over the next few months, we will be putting into actions things that we can do to help ensure that we all breathe in cleaner air.

At our assembly last Friday, some members of our Green Team and Green Patrol shared the results on our air monitoring project with the children. Each class was given a clean air pledge sheet and were asked to think of 3 pledges

to make between now and July.



We are looking forward to welcoming Amy Bartlett from Asthma and Lung UK to our school this Friday to lead a special assembly for us and to help us learn how we can become Clean Air Champions. God has made a beautiful world for us to live in and by working as a Community, we can help looked after God's Creation by helping to promote cleaner air. Our Liturgy Team have chosen a

beautiful Psalm and the Laudate Deum prayer as part of our Celebration of the Word.

Air Quality Workshop

The children worked in a groups and earnt important values on collaboration and team work where they built a powerful message on air quality through art. The children produced 5 masterpieces which will be professionally printed and will be proudly display in our school environment, sparking conversation and raising awareness about quality among our parents/ carers and the wider community.

Tell them about a book you have read and what you think about it. Maybe you liked the characters, or perhaps you enjoyed going on exciting adventures in faraway places.

Upload your illustration of a character or a scene from the story. This could be a drawing, painting or even digital artwork. Let them know what other books and authors you have enjoyed reading and why.

Get your parent or guardian to help you fill out your form and personal details.
