Anti Bullying Week

The theme of the week is "Choose Respect" which offers teachers the chance to have some really meaningful conversations with their classes.

There will be a special assembly on Tuesday to coincide with our 'Odd Socks Day'. The aim is to create an environment where 'respect and kindness thrive.' and to empower children and young people to not resort to bullying,

even when disagreements occur and remind adults to lead by

example, online and offline.

We would never be so naïve as to say bullying does not exist, but we are determined to act quickly and decisively whenever we hear of any such reports. I was delighted that, in response to last term's parent questionnaire, the vast majority of parents believed that either reports of bullying had been dealt with effectively, or had not had the need to report this at all. The safety and welfare of our pupils is always our top priority, and I thank parents for their unwavering support in promoting an anti-bullying philosophy.
