Revelation: The Gospel accounts of key events in the life of Jesus: nativity, passion, death, resurrection, ascension. *Jesus is risen: Ascension.*

Revelation: Gospel accounts of the coming of the Holy Spirit and transformation of the disciples. *Pentecost & power of the Holy Spirit The day of Pentecost.*

The Church: The gifts of the Holy Spirit which are given to individuals and groups for the service of the whole community. *The power of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles.*

The Church: The Way Jesus proclaimed Good News to everyone he met and the variety of responses. *Disciples on Road to Emmaus, Jesus appears to the apostles.*

Celebration: Church's celebrations of significant events in the life of Jesus. *Easter; Ascension; Pentecost.*

Life in Christ: Gospel accounts which show the love and complete self-giving of Jesus. *Jesus appears to the disciples on the road to Emmaus.*

Life in Christ: The suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus as a sign of love, sacrifice and the source of new life. *Jesus is alive, Jesus appears to the disciples, The meaning of the Resurrection.*

Revelation: The Gospel accounts of key events in the life of Jesus: nativity, passion, death, resurrection, ascension. *Last Supper; Passion, Death, Resurrection*

Revelation: Gospel accounts of the coming of the Holy Spirit and transformation of the disciples. *Pentecost & results of the transformation.*

The Church: Key images of the Church in Scripture and Tradition; the implications of this imagery for community life. *Church as People of God, Body of Christ and the implications for community life.*

The Church: The cost of discipleship. *Peter and Stephen.*

The Church: Teaching role of the apostles (e.g.) through New Testament letters. *Peter & Stephen spread the good news; Paul's missionary journeys.*

The Church: How the local church is 'good news' for people and how everyone can have a part in it. *Different types of communities, the community of the Church, The Church celebrates.*

Celebration: Church's celebrations of significant events in the life of Jesus. *Resurrection; Ascension; Pentecost.*

Other Religions: Children will have a visit from a Greek Orthodox Priest to talk about Greek Easter.
