Thank you to all the pupils and staff who were able to attend our Pentecost Liturgy last Thursday in a

packed Cathedral. It was a delight to see the smiling faces of pupils, staff and visitors as they entered the Cathedral. The sound of the Steel Pans filled the Piazza drawing a large crowd of on-lookers. The celebration of the liturgy was, as Bishop Paul remarked, a celebration of the wonderful diversity we are so privileged to have throughout our diocese.

Back to local matters, and I am making a special mention of our teachers who are currently completing extended training offered by our diocese. The course, entitled

Foundation Stones, is aimed at arming all teachers in Catholic schools with background or additional knowledge of the Catholic faith. Parents will remember that we achieved an 'outstanding' judgement at our most recent diocesan inspection for the Catholic Life of the School, and this shows our commitment to developing this even further. Thank you to our teachers for dedicating so much of their time for this training

Finally, the children participated in a special assembly this morning celebrating Family Love. The message is that, whatever the composition of your family, they are places where we learn to love and forgive. Pope Francis has declared that we all celebrate this in the week ahead.
