Parent Consultations

Spring Term Parent Consultations will be taking place on the week of Monday 20 March. These meetings, that have been online since the 2020 lockdown, are a crucially important element in the home - school partnership that is fundamental to the children's progress in learning.

As has been suggested previously, the aim for this round of consultations is to introduce a 'hybrid' model, with some consultations being held online, others in person at school. Feedback that we receive from parents suggest that there is a balance between those who prefer the convenience of an online consultation with those who prefer the more personal nature of a face to face meeting.

Offering both options does present logistical challenges, however, and so that we can most effectively organise the event, we are asking parents to take part in an short online survey. Accessed via the school website, answering a few simple questions will allow us to offer the most suitable balance of online and face to face meetings.

There has been a lot of interest and enthusiasm for our proposed nursery plans announced in the school newsletter last week. I am delighted by the positive response. Over the coming term we need to consult with other local providers and put our plans and policies in place. If that all goes to plan, equipping the classroom and publicity will come next.

As we do not even have our admissions policy prepared yet, we cannot advise parents of the application process. I would assure parents, however, a record is being kept of those who have emailed the school office have to express an interest.

Near the end of each term, we intend to ask for volunteers to wash any unclaimed clothing, and offer it to parents for a small donation. The more parents who offer, the fewer items each will need to wash! The current cost of living crisis might well make this initiative very welcome. Following that, it's a donation to the next Happy School Bag collection.

To summarise, we require:

- Volunteers to wash unclaimed uniform

For some of our older children, it will be a very practi-

cal responsibility to collect uniform, organise it and to run an old uniform sale.

School Places for September 2023

The Governors invite applications from the parents of children born between 1st September, 2018 and the 31st August 2019.

Parents need to complete:

- 1. The application to the London Borough of Enfield (online).
- 2. The supplementary information form from our website, please download, complete and email to us. Please include in your email a copy of your child's baptismal certificate.
- 3. A certificate of Catholic Practice. To obtain this, please visit the Parish website www.catholoicenfield.org and follow their instructions.

Whilst the Borough application is completed online, the two other forms should be submitted to the school together in person or via email to admin@st-georges.enfield.sch.uk Closing Date for Admissions: **15th January 2023.**

Applications across Enfield were significantly lower this year, to compound lower numbers of applicants last year. This has resulted in significant numbers of schools in the borough having surplus places, with many reducing the size of the school intake to lessen the financial impact of the lower numbers. It is worth noting that all applicants to our school last year were offered a place.
