Prevent

This week, staff were joined by school governors to refresh their training on 'Prevent', the mechanism by which early signs of radicalisation can be identified. It was brilliantly presented by Evie Gibson from Enfield Council and we thank her for presenting the information with such clarity.

One of her most important messages was the power of the internet and social media in the lives of young people. Please be very aware of your children's activity on social media, being particularly mindful of minimum ages for using these platforms, for example: WhatsApp (16), Tik Tok (13) and You Tube (13).

Eruption

Parents of year 3 children will know that their children are usually greeted each morning with calmness, and gentle music welcoming them. This week, however, their learning has erupted into life. So much so that I could not resist sharing some of their explosive artwork with you. Their teachers wrote:

"The children enjoyed learning about the different artists whose work was inspired by volcanoes such as Turner, Marlow, Hokusai and even Andy Warhol. They then used oil or soft pastels to re-create their own erupting volcano. Taking this a step further, they progressed to working in 3d, applying mod-roc to newspaper and cardboard - once dried, they were painted with acrylic paints and although these volcanoes remained dormant over the Christmas holidays, there has been a sudden vibrant explosion of red-hot molten lava! Everyone agrees - they look fantastic."


