We extend a massive thank you to Fr Daniel and Fr Timothy who joined us yesterday to lead special Ash Wednesday liturgies for our staff and children. They very clearly outlined the significance of the holy day and I'm sure that many of your children would have arrived home last night full of new information to share.

Next week we are very excited to be welcoming Bishop John Sherrington into school. He will be leading Mass, a special liturgy and meeting many of our children throughout his visit.

Friday is Spirituality Day. Held at various times through the school year, we dedicate a day to the children's' spiritual journey. There are lovely activities planned for the children to enjoy and engage with.

If all that does not make our children holy enough, year 5 also walk to our Church for reconciliation on Friday afternoon next week. That is following a special assembly lead by the Catholic Children's Society who will be launching their Lenten Appeal.

Strike Action

At this stage it is not possible to inform you of whether the school will remain open next Thursday, a day of strike action proposed by the National Education Union. Unions have advised teachers not to state their intentions of whether they will strike or not to headteachers, making it impossible to say how many staff will be at school. This means that at this present time, I cannot say whether there will be sufficient teachers to safely supervise the children. I hope to be able in a position to make a decision by Monday morning at the latest.

For those of you who drive your children to school, please:

- Drive carefully on the roads surrounding school
- Park considerately to our neighbours

- Make every effort to walk all or some of the way to school if possible. It's healthy and good for the environment.

We have been contacted by the owners of private land near the school, space used for parking for three businesses. Despite being asked, certain parents are repeatedly parking on their land, mostly at pick-up time. We are always trying to keep positive relationships with our neighbours and repeated inconsiderate, and even illegal, parking only serves to increase tension.

The owners of the businesses have informed me that they will be forwarding the details of the cars parked on their land to Enfield parking enforcement who do visit the area around our school and regularly issue fines.

Science Show

Earlier in the term we informed parents that the children will be enjoying two exciting science days scheduled for Wednesday 8th and Thursday 9th March. Such opportunities are only possible with the generous donations without which the school could simply not afford to organise them. Payments of £2 (Rec/Year 1), and £3 (Years 2-6) are invited on ParentPay.

All children will go to a "Science Show" on Wednesday and also on Wednesday every year 2 and year 3 class will have an engaging workshop. The theme of Wednesday's workshops will be Adaptations, based on how animals adapt through evolution and each pupil will take home an adaptation butterfly. On Thursday there will be additional workshops for years 4-6 based on the theme Green Earth where each pupil will make and take home their own solar powered oven.

I would like to thank Mrs Fearnley for organising these Heartstopper exciting days for the children.

Free 1-minute maths app from WhiteRose.

Designed for use both in class and at home, the WhiteRose 1-minute maths app helps children build greater number confidence and fluency. It's all about targeted practice in engaging, one-minute chunks!

What's the app about? The app is aimed at Key Stage 1 pupils (ie. age 5-6 years). Individual one-minute tasks focus on adding and subtracting - and on 'Subitising', the skill of instantly recognising the number of items in a group without counting. Multiplication and division topics are also now available!

How do we use it? Your child can choose any topic they want to try. They then answer a unique series of questions (so it's a different set of questions every time). If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button will give a helpful clue by showing the question in a different but familiar way.

When the one minute's up, they'll see a feedback screen telling them how they've done.
