STEM Appeal

The Enfield Town School Partnership (ETSP) offers our children a host of enrichment activities that we regularly benefit from. The partnership consists of around 20 local schools who organise a host of events that add value to our offer for the children. You may remember that we recently won the ETSP Debating Competition, for example.

One of the most significant events of the year is the STEM Fair, held at Chase Community School, this year on Wednesday 5 July. In order for it to happen, we need some volunteers who work in STEM-related occupations. If you are interested and available, it provides a wonderful way of supporting our school, and the schools in the wider Enfield community.

On Wednesday 5 July ETSP is delivering a Big Bang Fair at Chace Community School. ETSP is looking for a number of STEM Ambassadors from a range of back-

grounds and experience levels to help with an exhibition of science projects created and designed by Year 5 (age 10) pupils. Your role will be to judge the children's projects using marking criteria (provided) to help determine the overall winning projects.

The fun-packed day offers a carousel of different STEM activities for children to participate in. Children also get to experience a day in a secondary school and work in Chace Community's science labs. It is an energetic and rewarding day not only because you learn more about school life but also because we provide volunteers with refreshments and lunch!
