RE is at the heart of everything we do here at St George's. It is through Religious Education that we that we lay the foundations for our pupils to grow into respectful, spiritual and moral individuals; supporting them in developing and deepening their relationship with God. The children are encouraged to reflect and ask questions about their faith.

Children engage and take part in Acts of Worship in the classroom, where the children have opportunities to plan and lead their own worship, choosing appropriate resources to aid this (i.e., candles, pebbles) and their own mission for everyone to work on (ie. say kind words to someone). This ownership of their worship allows the children to further strengthen their beliefs and relationship with God.

-The Kingdom of God -Justice -Exploring the Mass -Jesus the Messiah -The Transforming Spirit - Called to Serve




Reading

- We are following a reading scheme called 'Big Cats' for KS2 children.
- Transition from last year
- Fluency and comprehension skills.
- Range of comprehension skills
- Reading domains assessed against: Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explain, Retrieval, **Summarising**
- Children will then be grouped with readers working at the same level, allowing them to read together through guided reading activities.
- Reading independently at school and at home daily (15 - 20 minutes). The children should be reading challenging texts.
- Class reader based on our topic.



Spellings

- Spellings are sent home on a Friday; children are then tested on these words the following Friday. Your child will need to know their log in for DB Primary.
- Weekly spelling lesson in class.
- Spellings are taught systematically within word families.
- Spelling practice is so important, research has found that spelling, reading, writing and comprehension skills are all closely linked. The more children practise spellings the more likely they are to enjoy reading and writing.

Writing in Year 6

Working at the expected standard

The pupil can:

- write effectively for a range of purposes and audiences, selecting language that shows good awareness of the reader (e.g. the use of the first person in a diary; direct address in instructions and persuasive writing)
- · in narratives, describe settings, characters and atmosphere
- integrate dialogue in narratives to convey character and advance the action
- select vocabulary and grammatical structures that reflect what the writing requires, doing this mostly appropriately (e.g. using contracted forms in dialogues in narrative; using passive verbs to affect how information is presented; using modal verbs to suggest degrees of possibility)
- use a range of devices to build cohesion (e.g. conjunctions, adverbials of time and place, pronouns, synonyms) within and across paragraphs
- use verb tenses consistently and correctly throughout their writing
- use the range of punctuation taught at key stage 2 mostly correctly[^] (e.g. inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech)
- spell correctly most words from the year 5 / year 6 spelling list,* and use a dictionary to check the spelling of uncommon or more ambitious vocabulary
- maintain legibility in joined handwriting when writing at speed.²

Working at greater depth

The pupil can:

- write effectively for a range of purposes and audiences, selecting the appropriate form and drawing independently on what they have read as models for their own writing (e.g. literary language, characterisation, structure)
- distinguish between the language of speech and writing³ and choose the appropriate register
- exercise an assured and conscious control over levels of formality, particularly through manipulating grammar and vocabulary to achieve this
- use the range of punctuation taught at key stage 2 correctly (e.g. semi-colons, dashes, colons, hyphens) and, when necessary, use such punctuation precisely to enhance meaning and avoid ambiguity.^

Maths in Year 6

In maths, we strive for efficient, clear strategies to enable the children to solve real life reasoning problems.

The topics change weekly. Every week, we will update a timetable on DB Primary of the topics being taught the following week for maths and literacy.

Children must use TT Rockstars for 15 minutes a day to develop their fluency so that they can apply these skills in all topic areas.


During our maths workshops we demonstrate how we teach different calculation methods in Maths.



CGP books


- Revision books for reading, grammar punctuation & spelling and maths.
