- Drive carefully on the roads surrounding school

There have been a number of complaints from local residents this week. In addition, parking on double yellow lines causes potentially dangerous situations. One example this week was a parent with a push chair who had no choice but to push her child into the road to go around a car that was obstructing the pedestrian walkway.

Flu Vaccine

The school nursing team are due to come into school to deliver the flu vaccine on **Monday 20 November**.

All children in reception through to year 6 are eligible for this vaccine. Once again this year, they are offering the flu nasal spray and also the injectable version which does not contain porcine gelatine.

A letter is being distributed with the newsletter today. The letter contains a link to the online eConsent form.

The cut off for children to get their flu vaccine with the service this year is 15th December. They will not be able to administer any flu vaccines after that date.
